Cervical screening (smear test) does not check for womb cancer. Knowing the signs and symptoms could save your life.



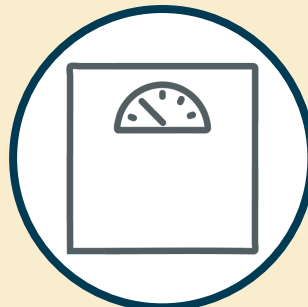
Bleeding after menopause



Blood in your urine



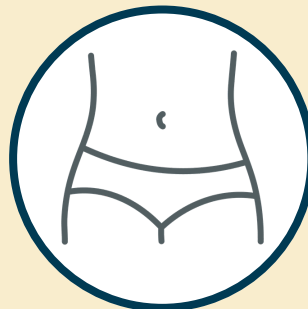
Bleeding in between periods or after sex



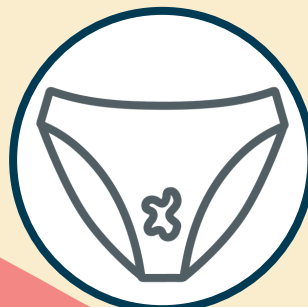
Unexplained weight loss
